Security and Privacy

This document sets out how Mobysoft Ltd handles data that identifies you.

At Mobysoft, we believe strongly in protecting the privacy of our visitors' personal information. This statement describes the privacy practices we apply to the Mobysoft website. As part of that, it also expresses our approach to complying with the data protection laws that apply in the United Kingdom.

1. The information we collect

- Registration Information When you contact us via the Mobysoft website "contact us" form, you
 may have to provide your name, company, position, email address, telephone number and some
 optional notes about yourself. This will help us to deal with your enquiry as effectively and
 efficiently as possible.
- Tracking software We use Lead Forensics to count the number of people who use the site and to analyse how they use it. We do this to make sure that our sites are as good as they can be and this is the primary evidence we use when trying to improve what we offer to users. Lead forensics does not collect personal information but does provide insight at a corporate level via IP tracking.
- Cookies By using this site you are consenting to the use of cookies. Cookies are small files of letters or numbers that we put on your computer.

We use these types of cookies on our websites:

- Strictly necessary cookies: these cookies are essential for your use of our websites and identify that you are logged in when using secure areas of our sites.
- Performance cookies: these cookies collect anonymous statistics about how people/visitors use our sites and which pages are the most popular. These cookies help us to improve the sites.

Cookie Name	Purpose
utma	This cookie is used to monitor the number of times a visitor has been to the site related to the cookie, when they first visited the site, and when they were last on the site.
utmb &utmc	These two cookies work together to establish how long a visit has taken. b signals when a user enters the site and c signals when a user leaves.
utmz	Captures how a visitor accessed the site including: which search engine was used, what link was clicked on, what keywords were used and geographical location.

We do not use:

• Functionality cookies: these cookies help you to use a website. They store information about choices you make or information you give. They are also used when you watch a video and also to remember your login information.



 Cookies that track your activity on other websites or allow any third parties to use cookies on our sites.

- Log files Like most standard Web site servers we use log files. This includes internet protocol (IP) addresses, browser type, internet service provider (ISP), referring/exit pages, platform type, date/time stamp, and number of clicks to analyse trends, administer the site, track user's movement in the aggregate, and gather broad demographic information for aggregate use. IP addresses, etc. are not linked to personally identifiable information. (IP addresses are tied to personally identifiable information to enable our Web-based service).
- Email addresses We do not make your e-mail address available to any third parties.

2. Sharing and use of information

We do not sell lists of email addresses to third parties.

- Newsletters We issue occasional emails, which contain Mobysoft News, updates on our propositions and industry news which we feel may be of value to you.
- Information requests –If you have requested more information via our online form, we may use the details submitted to contact you.
- Place of processing The personal information held by us is held on and processed by computers situated in the United Kingdom.

3. Security

We have security measures in place to protect our database and access to this database is under strict guidelines.
